drivers accept responsibility!

The Brunswick County Sheriff's Office is pleased to introduce the S.T.O.P.P.E.D. program, a parental notification system developed to help reduce the number of young drivers involved in motor vehicle accidents.

Motor vehicle crashes are the leading cause of death for 15 to 20 year olds. The "Teen Driver Crash" report to Congress July 2008 stated that teen drivers due to a combination of immaturity and inexperience, have a higher propensity for risk-taking behaviors than do older and more experienced drivers. The report continued to state that teenagers appear to use new technology at a greater rate than older people do. The latest survey of driver cell phone use found younger drivers ages 16-24 using hand-held cell phones at a higher rate than older drivers, and younger drivers are less experienced at multitasking while driving and are therefore more easily distracted than their older counterparts. Younger drivers are particularly vulnerable to certain high-risk driving situations, such as driving at night, after drinking alcohol, with other teenage passengers, and when unbelted.



ON YOUR MARK

Parents will register with the Brunswick County Sheriff's Office any vehicle that will be operated by any driver 18 and younger

GET SET

An identification decal is issued and affixed to the lower left corner of the rear window of each registered vehicle.

STOPPED

If for any reason the registered vehicle, when operated by a driver 18 or younger, is stopped by an officer, the officer will complete a notification card providing the following information:

Time and location of the stop.

Driver's name and number of occupants.

Reason for stop.

Whether any traffic tickets were issued

Parents will be notified concerning these details to enable you to enforce any parental rules that often coexist with teenage driving privileges.
